Complex Connexions



Complex Connexions is a not-for-profit organisation based in Northumberland offering support to parents of children and teens who are neurodivergent, a non-medical umbrella term that describes people with variations in the way they respond to the world and can include Autism and attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder (ADHD). Their mission is to deepen the understanding of neurodivergence with individuals and their support network. It was first set up in 2020 by teacher, Shelley Farnham, following her son's ADHD diagnosis.

Since it started, it has grown to become an online support community for parents and carers, providing workshops and strategies to help adults nurture positive and effective understanding, communication, and connection with neurodivergent children.

With the support from the Customer Donation Fund, Shelley Farnham, founder, and director at Complex Connexions said:
